Background

- **Texas Education Code Sec. 51.940** governs student debit cards stating that “[t]he governing board of an institution of higher education may establish a program to provide students enrolled at the institution with a debit card.”
- **Section 07.12.1.f., *Regents’ Rules***, requires Board approval on contracts that are subsequently found to be required by law or by the policy to be approved by and executed by the board. The contract shall continue to be in full force and effect, but shall be submitted for ratification at the next available board meeting.

ASU: Student Debit and Stored Value Cards



ASU OneCard:

- Official identification card for all students at Angelo State University.
- Used to access university services, events and facilities.
- Can elect to use as an ASU OneAccount (administered through HigherOne), their ASU OneCard can also be used as a debit MasterCard.
- ASU dining plans, including RamPoints, can only be used at on-campus locations.
- The ASU OneCard can be used at any location, on- or off-campus.
- ASU OneCard program has been in place prior to joining Texas Tech University System.

TTU: Student Debit and Stored Value Cards



TTU Raider Card:

- Official identification card for all faculty, staff, and students at TTU.
- Raider Cash is a stored value account where funds can be deposited and then used to access university services, events and facilities at several different locations. There is no bank affiliation with the stored value account.
- Raider Cash can be used at printing stations, Barnes & Noble bookstore on campus, Cowamongus, and select Ovations concession stand locations.
- Only off-campus location is Varsity Bookstore which has partnered with the ID System.
- TTU Student Government Association has pursued an option to allow Raider Cash usage at additional off-campus locations if the merchant contractually agrees to accept the Raider Card. Purchase of alcohol or tobacco products will not be allowed. SGA is currently working with UGryd to sign up merchants with anticipated launch, Spring 2016.
